THE PILKINGTON ACTIV™ STUDENT AWARDS IN ASSOCIATION WITH ARCHITECTURE TODAY

Submission date 16th May

- Entries are invited for the third round of the 2005 Spectrum Awards – the Pilkington Activ™ Student Awards in association with Architecture Today
- Chris Wilkinson of Wilkinson Eyre and Deborah Saunt of DSDHA are guest judges
- Awards will be made for the best use of any type of glass in student work
- Award-winning projects will be featured in Architecture Today
- Award winners also receive a £500 prize
- Submission deadline: 16th May 2005

The awards scheme provides an opportunity for students (or their tutors) to submit work completed in either the current or the last academic year. Any kind of project – school, office, museum, house etc – using any type of glass is eligible.

There is no need for any additional work to be undertaken and there is no requirement for a technical exploration of the glazing. Moreover work produced at either undergraduate or postgraduate level can be submitted. The single criterion is that the project should explore and exploit the architectural potential of glass.

The awards are judged by a distinguished panel comprising award-winning architects Chris Wilkinson of Wilkinson Eyre and Deborah Saunt of DSDHA; AT editors Ian Latham and Mark Swenarton; and Garry Smith of Pilkington.

Five award-winning schemes will be published in Architecture Today, each on a double-page spread, between January and July 2005. Award winners also receive a prize of £500 per scheme.

Submission details The competition is open to undergraduate and postgraduate students (full-time or part-time) enrolled in architecture schools in the UK in the academic year 2003-2004 or 2004-5.

Only one entry per person or per group is permitted. Entries that have been submitted previously for another national or international competition or award are permitted.

Not more than the equivalent of two A3 sheets (ie two A3, or four A4) are to be submitted, unmounted and packed flat. These should include:

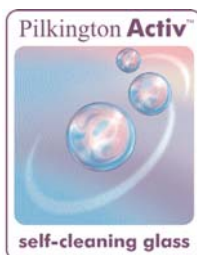
- drawings sufficient to convey the character of the proposal.
- a typed statement (max 200 words) describing both the use of glass and the overall design.

Entrants should write on the reverse of each sheet their name, address, phone numbers, e-mail, college, course, year and tutor. For group entries, the names of all entrants should be stated on the back of each drawing. Original drawings should not be sent. No disks or electronic data will be accepted. Responsibility cannot be accepted for loss or damage.

Submission of an entry confers on the organisers, Pilkington plc and Architecture Today plc, the right to reproduce (both in their own publications and elsewhere) all pictures and particulars of the design in whatever form they wish (subject to observance of legal requirements). It also signifies confirmation by the entrant/s that he/she/they were bona fide students at a UK architecture school.
